

About the programme

SHARE aims to enhance diversity and inclusiveness within the social sciences at Cambridge, and in UK academia more broadly through improved access to research experience.

- Fourth year of the scheme, third year in person
- 26 students have been through the programme
- Previous participants have gone on to postgraduate study and research at Essex, Bristol, Cambridge, and elsewhere
- Now open to those who have graduated but not gone on to PG study
- Will spend time immersed in live research projects to get a flavour of what postgraduate research is really like
- Provided with training and development sessions
- Unique experience of living in a College





Format of the internship

- Aim to assign two interns to each project
- Spend one day a week (Mondays) on training and personal development
- Spend other four days in the department working on the research project
- Evenings and weekends are your own
- Final day presentations from each intern about your experience (you will get help and support to achieve this!)







Making an application

- Review the project options online
- Gather your documentation transcripts, evidence of funding etc
- Prepare your personal and project statements
- Line up your referee
- Make your application
- Closing date is 23.45 on Friday 1 March
